- Human Relation and Communication Skills (2601546)
 This Course provides the candidates with a greater understanding of the importance of human relation within the context of nursing. Major forces influencing human behavior as well as the major themes in human relation such as communication, interview, counseling, productivity, leadership, conflict, and conflict resolution will be addressed. - Nursing research and evidence based practice (2601521)
 This course enables the student to understand the integrated processes of designing and concluding a research. The student will learn how to generate, formulate and justify the research idea, how to search the literature and different data resources, the different types of research designs, how to design a questionnaire, to select sample and to write research proposal. This course focuses on the assimilation of knowledge concerning evidence-based practice in nursing by reviewing and evaluating quality of research evidence.
- Advanced Obstetrics I (2601542)
 This course provides the candidates with advanced knowledge and skills in normal and abnormal labor and delivery. The comprehensive and diverse theoretical contents will prepare the candidates for the art of hospital and out of hospital birth and enable the master candidates to conduct normal delivery, to judge and to integrate their knowledge which are related to the provision of health care for women throughout the childbirth process.
- 4 Advanced Obstetrics II (2601545)
 The course focuses on providing the candidates with the technical skills that enable them to conduct normal deliveries independently, to report and/or to refer any deviation from normal and provide high quality management for women during normal and abnormal labor
- Health Education and Counseling for Midwives (2601543)

 The course is designed to provide the students with the essential knowledge and skills to be able to educate and counsel women throughout pregnancy, labor & delivery, postpartum period, those who seek family planning services and women with common gynecological problems.
