Brief Description of Undergraduate Courses Taught: (Course Title – Code: Description)



Second Language acquisition aims to help students identify major issues in current SLA research and theory and be knowledgeable about the theoretical approaches to second language acquisition.

Phonetics and Phonology provides students with an introduction to phonetics and phonology. It presents a description of how speech sounds are produced, and it gives practice on all phonemes in English and how they are pronounced, mainly in Received Pronunciation. The course also helps learners to transcribe words and sentences, and develop their awareness of several suprasegmental features such as the concept of syllable; the nature and structure of the English syllables, and the concept of intonation and stress.

Grammar 2 is designed to introduce advanced structures to be used in different situations in real life. The course focuses more on the practical aspect and allocates more time for oral and written application. The course aims at allowing students to express themselves using more advanced structures and more idiomatic English used by native speakers. This will assist them in understanding and communicating efficiently and effectively in writing and in speech.

Grammar 1 is designed to introduce basic language structures and essential skills required for correct oral and written communication. The course focuses on practice and application more than theory or rules, assessed by using the basic rules to produce correct sentences, structures, and short reports. The course aims at improving students' skills and exposing them to real interactive linguistic situations in class. This will assist students to apply learnt structures appropriately in real life situations.

Introduction to Linguistics give students an overview of the field of modern linguistics and basic skills in linguistic analysis. It offers an introduction to linguistics and the study of language and assumes no previous knowledge of the subject. It aims to explore current ideas in many of the areas which make up the discipline - i.e., Phonology, Morphology, Lexical Semantics and Syntax. The course also provides a systematic investigation of the properties of human language, how languages are learned and how they change over time.

Research Methodology introduces students to the fundamentals of research and the scientific methods in planning and conducting research. It presents the components of a research paper starting from choosing a topic and formulating research questions and objectives to devising research recommendations and conclusions. At the same time, it challenges them to use their theoretical knowledge about research in writing a well-designed research proposal utilizing their writing, synthesizing, searching, documentation, presentation, and critical and analytical thinking skills.

Senior Project (Research Track) enables students to practice a range of research skills through writing a well-developed and well-structured academic research paper required for graduation.
